
An Invitation to ALL! Do you Know someone who is Interested in becoming Catholic

Redefining marriage will affect every Australian. Overseas experience suggests that legalising same-sex marriage may well result in a loss of freedom in five key areas:

Freedom of RELIGION

No protections have been offered to allow individuals to hold, teach and practise their faith about marriage, nor to other faith-based institutions.

Freedom of SPEECH

People's right to speak freely is endangered if they can be dragged before anti-discrimination tribunals, fined or fired for speaking in favour of real marriage.



Freedom of EDUCATION

Faith-based schools may no longer be free to teach what their church teaches regarding marriage and sex; parents in state schools may not be able to remove their children from radical gender programmes.



Freedom of ASSOCIATION

People's rights to associate freely are endangered if they can be sacked or persecuted in the workplace, meeting venues denied to them, or their businesses boycotted or fined, for being pro-marriage.



Freedom of EMPLOYMENT No protections have been offered to employees from

being harassed at work into supporting same-sex marriages.

"Things will be much worse if same-sex marriage becomes the law of the land. You can join with me to stop this happening by voting no in the postal plebiscite."



150th Anniversary of the Dominican Sisters in Australia A Brief History

On 4th September 1867, after a perilous journey of three months on a tiny wooden sailing ship, the 'Martha Birnie', eight brave and generous Irish Dominican Sisters disembarked in Sydney. They immediately went to St Patrick's Church at the Rocks to give thanks for a safe journey and ask a blessing on their new venture. They were on their way to Maitland NSW, where they had been invited by the Irish Bishop, Dr James Murray, to found a community, and a Congregation, in his new diocese among people many of whom were part of the Irish Diaspora. The Sisters' ministry would be to teach young boys and young women of all classes their Catholic faith and provide them with all the tools they would need to live as good Christian men and women in the relatively new colony. The Bishop who was coming to meet them was held up by serious flooding in Maitland. Finally, on 9th September they boarded the paddle steamer 'Morpeth' and sailed up the coast and down the Hunter River, arriving at Morpeth, and travelling on to West Maitland joined by almost impassible mud roads, on 10th September 1867. They were greeted warmly by the people of the district and taken to St John's Cathedral for Benediction and the 'Te Deum'. Then the Bishop accompanied them to the new convent around the corner and said 'you are home now at last'.

Liturgy of the Word 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



First Reading Ez 33:7-9

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows, 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, however, you do warn a wicked man to renounce his ways and repent, and he does not repent, then he shall die for his sin, but you yourself will have saved your life.' The Word of the Lord

(R.) O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts.

1. Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. (R.)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

Gospel Mt 18:15-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, vou have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.' The Gospel of the Lord

A Scriptural Sandwich

The placement of this discourse about confronting your brother within the gospel of Matthew helps to shed light on its meaning. Immediately preceding this passage is the parable of the Lost Sheep, about leaving the 99 to go out in search of the one lost sheep. Immediately following this week's passage is the parable of the unmerciful or unforgiving servant who, despite receiving forgiveness of his own debt from his master, throws a fellow servant in debtors prison for failing to pay back money owed. The three passages together give a detailed discourse on forgiveness and reconciliation – dealing with those who have sinned, even against you personally and the powerful call to compassion and mercy.
