The following is one of the short essays written by our parishioners in preparation for the Archbishop's Pastoral Visitation in July/August:

Dear Archbishop,

What does "Living as a Catholic" mean? We hear many different opinions today not only from families and friends, but from complete strangers through social media. As it is often the bad news and negative comments that are discussed, we begin to doubt our own beliefs, our faith and our moral values. We become lost and forget to reflect on what really matters in our lives. What is true happiness? Where do we place our love and hope? How do we keep our faith in God wholeheartedly?

These are difficult questions if we are to answer them seriously. It is tempting to go straight to Google (I admit I did!) but the true answers are actually already in our hearts. "The spirit of God who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you." Romans 8:11

Living as a Catholic can bring burdens and blessings.

When the 'cross we bear' gets too hard and unrewarding, every day becomes a burden. The natural choice is to move away from the Lord and turn to easier options that have no rules or requirements. But living as a Catholic should be so much more than attending Sunday masses, reading the Bible, praying the Rosary, and saying Grace before meals. It should be a completely voluntary commitment to follow God's teachings. That is, to live life that treasures people over possessions, relationships over riches, and serenity over success. "For we live by faith, not by sight" 2 Corinthians 5:7; and "Life is not measured by how much you own" Luke 12:15

Overcoming the perception of burden is easy when we count the many blessings. "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above" James 1:17. Faith is the gift of greatest value because "with God, all things are possible" Matthew 19:26. Faith not only teaches us to be grateful of God's gifts, it gives us hope to overcome fear during times of struggle and pain. "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" Joshua 1:9. And what more can we ask for when the Almighty Father protects us unconditionally? "The Lord says, I will guide you along the best pathway for your life. I will advise you and watch over you." Psalm 32:8.

Living as a Catholic today doesn't have to be complex or demanding. Don't get distracted by other ideas! Simply open your heart to God, pray faithfully and love deeply. You cannot go wrong if you "let all that you do be done in love" 1 Corinthians 16:14; because "God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God and God in them." 1 John 4:16. - Carmen Chan -

First Reading Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The just will live by faithfulness.

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes. Then the Lord answered and said,

Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail.
See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights,

but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 94:1-2. 6-9. R. v.8

- (R.) If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.
- Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. (*R.*)

So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God.

Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

Alleluia, alleluia!


The word of the Lord stands for ever; it is the word given to you, the Good News. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 17:5-10 If you had faith!

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.

'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."'

In our struggles to be faithful disciples, we frequently must endure periods when we feel abandoned by God. When we have been intent on serving God with genuine devotion, such times are particularly trying, for one would expect that God would not withdraw consolations. When this happens, the broken heart and the strained spirit cry out to God in complaint: How long? Why? We have all been worn down by life, tempted to give up, too weary to go on.

Faith in God is a gift for which we pray. It enables us to accomplish marvellous feats; with it we can move mountains. As unprofitable servants, we do not earn it; we have no right to claim it as our own. We are the ones from whom faithful service will be expected. We will be sent to plough the fields and tend the sheep. We will be called to serve at table.

The faith that is ours has been mediated to us through the community. We have heard about God and about Jesus from others, from our parents and families, from our teachers and those who preach, from those with whom we work and play. Faith comes from God, but through the mediation of the community. Timothy received faith from his mother and grandmother. It was strengthened in him through the imposition of Paul's hands and through his preaching of the word of God. Furthermore, what Paul taught had first been handed down to him from those who preceded him.
