ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY BEVERLY HILLS CONFERENCE WINTER APPEAL 2023

We will be conducting our Winter Appeal over two weekends May 20/21 handing out of envelopes at each door & May 27/28 collecting at each door. Donations \$2 & over are tax deductable please tick the box on the envelope indicating you would like a tax receipt.

This is the only appeal we make each year with winter fast approaching it is a time when we are called on to provide increased assistance as people start to struggle even more with the ever-increasing cost of living. People with families find it particularly hard going but the same can be said for single folks on low incomes. Often these people just manage in normal times but when they need to provide for something out of the ordinary it is our Conference that comes to their rescue to provide them with the help they need to keep their heads above water.

In 2022 we made 93 visits assisting around 300 persons at a cost of \$14138 with an average cost of \$152 per visit the average cost being much higher than last year. This has only been achieved due to the generous Parishioners of Regina Coeli Parish without your ongoing support we would not be in a position financially to provide the same level of support that we do currently. There are families & individuals within our Parish who in an effort to keep up with the increasing cost of living deprive themselves of food & spend winter nights without adequate heating. Just for a minute place yourselves in that position, perhaps there are Parishioners who have experienced hardship, without support life for them becomes a burden & they often feel isolated & abandoned but fortunately our Conference is there to help once again thanks to your generous support.

Our aim is to provide initial help, & often ongoing support depending on the circumstances, to relieve their hardship & follow up with guidance and encouragement to help them control their own destiny. Let us give you an example of our work to provide an insight into what we do & can achieve.

You may remember last year we spoke of Wendy, not her real name, a single mother with four children living in our Parish Area. We told you how she was rushed to hospital with a major problem & spent time in a coma in intensive care her life was in the balance for some weeks. Wendy appeared to be on the road to recovery & was looking forward to going home. She did finally return home after nearly 4 months in hospital but required substantial assistance. Her bed was inadequate for her needs & she could not afford the type of bed required so our Conference provided a brand-new top-quality bed that suited her needs. Her reply was "awesome" she was so grateful she had never before had a bed of that quality. Unfortunately, she had to return to hospital on several other occasions but is now doing well at home. We continued to provide support throughout 2022 then came Christmas. A few weeks prior to Christmas Wendy was in tears as she had no money for gifts for the children we gave extra support so Wendy & the family could have a good Christmas. *Continued on Page 3*

The Ascension of the Lord, Year A

21 May 2023

First Reading Acts 1:1-11

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them. he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world. Alleluia!



Gospel Mt 28:16-20

All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

The feast of the Ascension is really a kind of liminal moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times, a moment when we have left one place in our journey but have not yet arrived at a second. The glory of the Risen Christ has already been revealed in us, but not yet totally. The feast itself celebrates the exaltation of Jesus. Today we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at the right hand of God. Today we are overwhelmed by the reality of the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity. Like the conquering creator-god, he has overcome his enemy (death) and now reigns over his new creation (the church).

Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the church. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists. He ministers through its prophets and pastors. In and through the church, Jesus continues to heal and to comfort; to forgive and to include. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have not been left alone: we have each other. Together we make up the new body of Christ. Together we await the fullness of this body. It is this new body that stands in between the times, secure in what we have, confident of what we will be given.
